

MARKET ALERTS

Asparagus: Large to Jumbo sizes are very limited on both coasts; Smalls and Standards are more available. Cooler weather in Peru and Mexico's production shift are tightening supply. Expect higher markets and limited availability in the coming weeks.

Blackberries: Demand exceeds supply. California production may rise next week with warmer weather. Open market product is scarce as shippers focus on contracts.

Brussel Sprouts: Production is ongoing in the Pacific Northwest, Mexico, California, North Carolina, New Jersey, and transferred fruit is available in Florida..

Lemons: Markets remain strong with District 2 (Ventura/Oxnard) as the only active region. Sizes 165ct and smaller are very limited. Choice grade dominates, while Fancy grade is reduced. Common quality issues include softness, decay, and scarring. Shippers are culling compromised fruit. Markets are higher than last summer due to strong demand and lower imports.

CROP UPDATES

Washington apple and pear harvests begin in August, with strong crops expected due to ideal weather. Apple volumes, especially Honeycrisp and Cosmic Crisp, could rise 20%+. Pears may see a 25% volume increase. Sizes are trending smaller, benefiting foodservice.

WEATHER

California: High pressure and a moderate marine layer will keep temperatures near or slightly above average this week. Morning lows range from mid-40s to upper 50s; highs from mid-60s on the coast to up to 100°F south of Soledad.

Mexico: Isolated showers expected through Thursday, increasing Friday, then isolated again Saturday. Temperatures remain seasonal with highs in the low 70s to low 80s and lows mid-50s to low 60s.

Florida: Warm temps with isolated to scattered storms through August 2nd. Rain totals 0.02–0.20" with some heavier storms. Highs in the 90s, lows mid-70s to low 80s. Tampa Bay winds gust 20–25 mph; lighter winds elsewhere.

Arizona: A stalled low off the West Coast is keeping low desert temps below normal through Friday. Warming returns this weekend, with highs rising from upper 90s–105°F to 105–110°F by Sunday. Lows remain in the low to mid-70s.

Freight this week sees slower demand for trucks down along the Mexican border and Florida. West coast is steady with volume meeting demand for open capacity. Expect markets to remain steady for this first week of August





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Apples

The apple market remains steady for now. While no varieties are completely out, supplies of Golds, Pinks, Honeys, and Cosmics are beginning to taper off with some shippers. Despite this, pricing has stayed fairly consistent. Looking ahead, new crop apples are expected to start arriving in August, with Ginger Golds and Galas by mid-month and Honeycrisp toward the end of the month.

Avocados

Markets on 48ct, 60ct, and 70ct are improving as the Flora Loca crop ramps up. We're seeing a mix of Normal and Flora Loca fruit, with shippers working to keep them separate. The Normal crop is nearly finished, and Flora Loca is becoming the primary harvest. Dry matter is in the low to mid 20s, compared to low 30s on the older crop, so expect longer ripening times. Fruit quality is strong, with very little #2 grade, which is typical for this season. California production is slowing and expected to wrap up in a few weeks. Offshore fruit continues to arrive on both coasts.

Choice grade dominates, while Fancy grade is reduced due to growing conditions. Quality issues like softness, early decay, and scarring are common. Shippers are working to cull compromised fruit. Expect higher markets than last summer, driven by strong demand and lower import supplies.

CALIFORNIA

High pressure and a moderate marine layer will keep temperatures near or slightly above average through the week. Morning lows will range from the mid-40s to upper 50s. Daytime highs will be mid to upper 60s along the coast, mid-70s to mid-80s in coastal valleys, and upper 80s to 100 degrees south of Soledad.



MEXICO

Isolated showers are expected through Thursday, with a slight increase in chances on Friday, then returning to isolated showers on Saturday. Temperatures will stay seasonal through August 2nd, with highs mostly in the low 70s to low 80s and lows in the mid-50s to low 60s from Tuesday morning through Saturday morning.



FLORIDA

Warm temperatures with isolated to scattered showers and thunderstorms are expected through August 2nd. Rainfall totals will generally range from 0.02" to 0.20", with higher amounts possible in some storms. Highs will be in the low to upper 90s from Tuesday through Saturday, with lows in the mid-70s to low 80s. Winds near Tampa Bay will gust between 20 to 25 mph, while most of southeast Florida will experience lighter, more variable winds through July 31st.



ARIZONA

Temperatures will stay near to above normal into the weekend. Southwest Arizona valleys will see highs between 108-111°F with lows in the mid 70s to low 80s. Southeast California can expect highs of 110-114°F and morning lows in the mid 70s. Monsoonal moisture returns to central and eastern Arizona on Thursday, bringing isolated showers to higher elevations near Phoenix. Light southwesterly winds will persist through Wednesday, strengthening to southerly gusts of 20-25 mph on Thursday.

Grop Appdates

Apples and Pears

The Washington apple harvest is fast approaching, with early varieties like Gala expected to begin in early August. Pear harvests will follow later in the month. Last year's extreme heat significantly reduced crop yields, but growers are reporting ideal conditions so far this season. As a result, expectations are high for a well-sized crop with excellent quality.

The combination of favorable weather and the natural alternate-bearing cycle is projected to bring substantial volume increases across most apple varieties. Acreage adjustments are also contributing to growth, with Honeycrisp and Cosmic Crisp expected to rise by 20% or more. Other varieties are also projected to see meaningful gains. This year's size profile is currently skewing smaller than last season, which may prove advantageous for foodservice markets.

Pear growers are also optimistic, anticipating a strong rebound after historically low yields in 2024. Early projections suggest a 25% increase in overall volume, with Bartlett, Anjou, and Bosc varieties showing particular promise. The earliest pears are expected to be harvest-ready by mid-August.

While future weather conditions could still impact the final outcome, the industry is entering the season with confidence and momentum.
